fulness. They haven't looked like or behaved like the chosen people of God. The people of Israel can't change on their own, but God can and will bring change to Israel and the whole world. Isaiah acknowledges God as the potter and the people of Israel as the clay. Only the potter can transform the clay. A day is coming when all the world will see His glory and turn to Him.

I Corinthians 1:3–9—St. Paul continues with the theme of the Second Coming. Given the imminent return of Christ, Paul reminds the Corinthian Christians that as they await eagerly Jesus' return that He will keep them strong in the faith until the end. Paul emphasizes God's work in keeping them steadfast in the faith until the day when they through faith will be judged blameless. Our lives centered in Christ allow others to see Him in us and believe in Him as their Savior so that they can also welcome Him with joy when He comes at the end of time.

Mark 13:33–37—Jesus Himself speaks about His return to earth. He reminds His disciples to "Be on guard! Be alert!" Using a metaphor of a man leaving his house and putting his servants in charge, He tells His disciples to "Keep watch because you do not know when the owner of the house will come back." In these words Jesus prepares His disciples for both the time when He will leave them and the time when He will return.

2. What hope does Isaiah still hold in spite of the Israelites' rebellion against God? See Isaiah 64:8.

4. Paul says with confidence, "He [Jesus] will keep you strong to the end, so that you will be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus." How can Paul speak with such confidence? See 1 Corinthians 1:4–6. What confidence do these words give you as you anticipate Judgment Day?

#### Connect

1. How do the words of Isaiah 64:8 and 1 Corinthians 1:3–9 provide you with confidence, as you respond to Jesus' words, "Be on guard! Be alert!"?
